
Notecard Examples

SOURCE CARD

The "A" in the lower right corner is the reference for your source. This is the first source from which you gather research. Each note card for this source will be labeled with the "A" followed by a number (A-1). This enables you to keep your cards organized.

FACT CARDS

Each fact card should include one fact. That fact should be summarized and broken down into as basic of a statement as possible. (See page 6) The reference number in the top left connects with the outline location. 3.1 Reputation is the first fact that goes in the 3rd section of the research paper on the Pittsburgh Steelers. 3.2 Reputation belongs in the same section, but is the 2nd fact for that paragraph. 2a.1 and 2b.1 go in the same section of the outline (Leadership) but different paragraphs (on-field vs. off-field) The letter in the bottom right makes citation easier when writing the research paper.
